BRIEF HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL

Sir P.S. Sivaswami Ayyar, a well known advocate, a visionary and a philanthropist, a pioneer in women's education had perpetuated and sustained a girls' school for over 100 years at Mylapore, Chennai and a school for boys at Thirukattupalli, Thanjavur. The benevolent philanthropist magnanimously sold his palatial home to finance and sustain the Lady Sivaswami Ayyar Girls' School.

Aptly, then the school was named after the founder, who had by then established two leading schools each one with a different flavour and catering to two different segments.

On 7th February 1989, the National Boys' and Girls' Education Society celebrated the 125th year of his birth in a fitting manner. The Society decided to set another milestone in his memory by starting a new school – Sir Sivaswami Kalalaya Senior Secondary School, on "Sudharma", the building constructed to commemorate his birth centenary.

On 17th July 2000, the society also started a Higher Secondary School in the name of Sir Sivaswami Kalalaya Higher Secondary School at Mandaveli. In the year 2020, to facilitate the expansion with lower classes, the school was shifted from its previous location to Sir Sivaswami Kalalaya Matriculation Higher Secondary School, No. 26A, East Mada Street, Mylapore, Chennai - 600 004.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE SCHOOL

- To provide quality academic education.
- To offer an educational curriculum that will promote the physical, mental, moral, social and emotional development of students.
- To offer a personalized system of education in which the individuality of every child is respected.
- To offer a congenial climate in which students feel happy and secure.
- To identify and develop leadership qualities in students and to equip them with the skills needed of worthy citizenship.

- To provide an educational setup which will create a constructive and sound value system in students.
- To promote a variety of interests and talents in students which will enable them to contribute to the rich cultural heritage of the world.

CURRICULUM

The school follows TAMILNADU STATE BOARD SYLLABUS for all classes and the medium of Instruction is ENGLISH.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Only the students who have successfully completed their respective previous classes are eligible for admission to the applied class.

Students seeking admission should submit the following:

- Copy of the marksheet of their respective previous class.
- Copy of birth certificate.
- Copy of Aadhaar card.
- Original Transfer Certificate.

ADMISSION TO XI STANDARD

The school aims at catering towards student's performance for higher education in quality Institutions. Tamil, and French are offered as Part – I Languages for Std XI and Part - II Language is English.

Only a student who has passed the Std.X State Board or CBSE or ICSE or any other equivalent board in Regular course with English Medium is eligible for admission to Std XI.

The school offers the following groups:-

Group 1	Maths, Physics, Chemistry & Biology
Group 2	Maths, Physics, Chemistry & Computer Science
Group 3	Economics, Commerce, Accountancy, Business Mathematics & Statistics

Pupils seeking admission must present the ORIGINAL TRANSFER CERTIFICATE from the previous school attended along with the Std. X mark sheet.

Students who have passed the STD X Public Examination conducted by an Examining Board other than Tamil Nadu MUST ENCLOSE THE ORIGINAL WITH 3 COPIES of the following:

- i) Transfer Certificate duly countersigned by the Educational Officer concerned.
- ii) Mark Sheet of the X standard Public Examination.
- iii) Copy of Community Certificate.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

SPECIAL FEATURES OF THE SCHOOL

FACULTY

The school has dedicated and competent faculty members. They are highly qualified and are encouraged to attend professional development programmes to be in tune with the latest trends in the field of education and especially so, in their areas of specialisation. Smart boards are used by teachers as an educational tool to make the teaching and learning more effective.

CLASS STRENGTH

The school's policy is to restrict the number of students in each class to ensure that students get maximum -personal attention.

MEDICAL INSPECTION

Every pupil will undergo free medical examination atleast once in a year. The school maintains a Medical Record for each pupil. In cases where follow - up action is necessary; it is communicated to the parents.

MAGAZINE

An annual magazine is released as E-Magazine every year.

Students are encouraged to contribute to the magazine.

SPORTS & GAMES

The Society's playground is open to the students for games and sports. Initial training and opportunity for ample practice is provided, in Table Tennis, Cricket, Tennis etc.

ACTIVITY CORNER

The activities for lower classes are aimed at equipping the children with life skills by making each child learn to explore and discover. Radha Swamy Centre of Excellence is a platform in which students are trained at Designing for a smart living with Tech and showcase their talents in various activities / projects.

To enrich the learning experience, smart boards have been installed in all classrooms, enabling teachers to use the multimedia resources and help students learn more effectively.

SPECIAL ASSEMBLY

It serves as a stage for students to showcase their hidden talents and out of the box thinking.

FIELD TRIPS

Field Trips are arranged as an extensive learning experience, supplementing classroom learning.

LIBRARY

The school has a well - stocked library. Students are encouraged to read books.

Students are not allowed to keep any book borrowed from the library for more than a week, unless further extension is sanctioned.

They should return their library books within the stipulated time or a fine will be levied daily. If a book is lost or damaged the pupil will have to bear the cost of the book. Exchange of library books amongst students is strictly prohibited.

Students of all classes must return the library books before 20th February. In lower classes, each class will have a reading corner to encourage reading habits.

CLUB ACTIVITIES

Commerce Club helps students to promote Organisational skills.

Eco Club creates awareness among students to ensure a clean, green and pollution free environment.

To appreciate different types of literature and develop linguistic skills, literary clubs were inaugurated.

FINE ARTS / YOGA

Children are offered the choice of any fine art including Dance and Yoga to tap their potential and hone their skill and talents in their respective fields.

SPRINGBOARD – Internship Program

The school has launched an internship program for higher secondary students, keeping in mind the huge spectrum of

opportunities present, the palpable need for equipping the student to make the right career choices. This Program is meant for the students of all three streams who will visit some reputed organisations to understand the corporate culture, the interlinking among various departments and above all, to gain an insight into the industry - Institution interaction.

ALUMNI MEET

The school hosts alumni meet every year. This gives an opportunity for the students to share their thoughts about their alma mater.

BHARAT SCOUTS & GUIDES

The school conducts programmes under The Bharat Scouts & Guides to encourage students to participate in leadership activities and to cultivate moral values in young minds.

AWARDS & PRIZES

Prizes are awarded for academic proficiency and outstanding performance in extracurricular activities. The whole school is divided into 4 houses namely Chatak, Hamsa, Kapotha and Mayur. Each house will be awarded points for the various activities such as academics, extra-curricular activities, lab activities, discipline, cleanliness etc., finally the points will be consolidated and a Rolling Shield will be given to the top scoring house, every year on Republic Day.

SCHOOL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT GOVERNMENT OF TAMILNADU

CIRCULAR TO PARENTS AND STUDENTS

1. Low hip or tight pants are not allowed.
2. Students should wear only half-sleeve shirts and they should not be of a tight fit.
3. Shirt should be stitched long enough so that it does not come out when tucked in.
4. Shirt should not be tucked in shabbily.
5. Finger and toenails should be cut regularly and the hair should be cut properly. (police haircut for boys)
6. Moustache should not cross the upper lip. Strict action will be taken if any student sports twisted moustache.
7. Students should not come to school wearing hand rubber bands, thread, earrings, or neck chains.
8. A student will be allowed to take leave only on submitting a leave note with the parent's signature to the class teacher / Principal.
9. Students are not allowed to bring motorbikes, cellphones, smartphones or smart-watches to school. If violated, the item will be confiscated and not be returned.
10. Students should come to school in uniform even on birthdays. Parents are expected to co-operate regarding the adherence to the above rules.

GENERAL RULES

STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED

- * to be in school by 8.25 a.m. If a student fails to reach the school on time, he/she will have to stay in the evening till 5.00 p.m. and should complete the work assigned to them. Frequent late comers may even be sent home.
- * to INTERACT ONLY IN ENGLISH in the school premises to acquire fluency in the language.
- * to keep themselves, their clothes, the classroom, and the school premises neat and clean. Scribbling on walls, scattering bits of paper, littering the floor, damaging the furniture and any other objectionable practice is strictly to be avoided and also punishable.
- * to walk in order and silence at any point of time when they move inside the school campus.
- * to be in the school premises unless a competent authority grants special permission.
- * to avoid using any kind of foul language. Teasing others and picking up unwanted fights inside the school premises will lead to disciplinary action.
- * to refrain from bullying inside the school premises. No such act will go unnoticed or unpunished.
- * to keep their text books and notebooks neatly covered and labelled.
- * to park & lock their cycles at the school premises.
- * not to have / bring any valuable items with them. The school will not be responsible for any loss of valuables brought by the students.

TO BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED BY ALL STUDENTS

Students should not:

- Wear gold, fancy, or costly ornaments.
- Bring money or any other costly or valuable items to school.
- Wear smart watches
- Bring any playthings like tatoos or WWF cards etc.
- Wear any kind of sports or fancy shoes at any given point of time.

- Enter or leave the classroom or loiter in the premises during class hours without permission.
- Bring mobile phones, smart watches, cameras, pendrive, i-pods to school.
- Use a power-driven vehicle

Boys are not permitted to:

- have long and fancy hair styles, wear bands, grow beards and moustaches.

Girls are not permitted to:

- have fancy hair styles.
- Use cosmetics like lipstick, eyeliners or fancy bindis.
- wear huge, dangling ear ornaments.
- pierce the ears in several places other than the ear lobes.
- Leave their hair loose. Hair should be neatly plaited as two plaits with black ribbons (classes VI to X). Hair should be neatly plaited with black bands (for classes XI to XII)

All students should:

- be neatly dressed in full school uniform, which includes I.D. cards and shoes, in school premises.
- periodically trim/file the nails and must use bindis according to their religion and custom.
- park their bicycles in the specified place only.
- alight from their vehicles 10-15 meters away from the school gate and not crowd in front of the gate obstructing free passage.
- bring only vegetarian food for Lunch.
- carry lunch with them regularly. Parents bringing lunch will not be entertained.

Students are accountable to the school authorities for their conduct and general behaviour in the school premises, while in school approved events or activities. Any objectionable conduct on the part of the student will make him/her liable for severe disciplinary action including expulsion.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

1. Attendance on re-opening days after terminal and annual holidays is compulsory.
2. It is compulsory for students to attend all school functions like Annual Day, Sports Day, Independence Day, Republic Day etc.
3. No pupil should absent himself / herself without prior permission except in the case of unforeseen circumstances.
4. Application for leave of absence shall be made with supporting documents on behalf of the pupil by his / her parent or guardian addressed to the Principal.
5. Students must produce a medical / fitness certificate when returning to school after a period of illness.
6. In case of sudden illness / unavoidable situation, parent should inform the principal / class teacher.
7. **Students will not be sent home immediately after they write their assignment tests or any exam.** In case they require leave on the health grounds and have opted to write the test, they are required to stay for half-a day.
8. A Student is expected to attend school for not less than 95% of working days. Any breach of this rule can affect their promotion to a higher class, or the student may not be allowed to appear for Public Examination.

EVALUATION

Periodic Assignment Tests, Two Terminal Examinations and Model Examinations will be conducted every year. In addition to the above Government Mid-term Tests and Comprehensive Revision Tests are also conducted for Board going students.

EXTENDED CLASSES

Students from classes 6 to 9 are supposed to attend special study hour which will be from 4.10 p.m. to 5.00 p.m. Students from classes X & XII will have classes upto 5.00 p.m if necessary.
